Background


In 2023, the EarlyON team delivered regular drop-in Play & Learn and Baby Time programs in nine locations across the County. Our Open Spaces program continued to be a popular draw for families looking for an outdoor adventure. Ready Set Learn was back in-person for 2023, supporting a number of families with the transition to kindergarten. New for 2023 was Bounce Back and Thrive, a parent workshop focusing on resiliency and self-regulation and the delivery of Roots of Empathy at River Heights Public School. The team continued to support the delivery of a variety of other special programs as well.

This Year-in-Review provides highlights of the variety of program opportunities offered over 2023 by the Middlesex EarlyON Team.

About our Families

EarlyON Child & Family Centres collect information from families to establish a database of visitors of caregivers and children to programs. The information collected includes Municipality of residence, contact information and number and ages of children.

A total of **588 new families** were registered with EarlyON in 2023.

- 43 families from Township of Lucan– Biddulph
- 41 families from Municipality of North Middlesex
- 130 families from Municipality of Middlesex Centre
- 130 families from Municipality of Strathroy-Caradoc

- 1 family from the Village of Newbury
- 134 families registered who reside outside of Middlesex County

In-person Programs



Types of In-person Programs

329 Baby Time Programs **Baby Time:** Baby Time is a play-based learning opportunity for infants 0 to 12 months of age and their caregivers. Our EarlyON Facilitator leads the group in singing and moving with baby as well as conversations around infant topics.

513 Play & Learn Programs **Play & Learn:** Play & Learn offers a play-based learning opportunity for children 0-6 years of age and their caregiver (s) in one of our indoor library program spaces. Activities planned by our EarlyON facilitators encourage positive parent and child interaction and inspire play and learning. We also offer a circle time (songs and stories) at the end of program.

Our outdoor Play & Learn programs offer a play-based learning in our Thorndale and Ilderton outdoor play spaces. Seasonal.

39 Open Spaces Programs **Open Spaces Outdoor Adventures:** Open Spaces offers free play and adventures in learning in the great outdoors. Child(ren) take the lead in these nature-based programs. Best suited for children 2 to 6 years of age, but children from 0-6 years are welcome.

19 Special Programs

16 Ready Set Learn sessions in 3 communities **Special Programs:** We offer on occasion indoor and outdoor special programs and events. Examples include visits to Splash pads, Apple Land field trips, Neighborhood Open Houses, Krafty Kids and more!

Ready Set Learn: Ready Set Learn is a 4-week program that will provide caregivers and their child with a learning experience that will support a successful school start. Each week we offer activities that will support children in developing skills and behaviours integral to the school transition. As well, caregivers are able to engage in conservations with our Early Childhood Educator on a variety of learning and development topics.



Evening or Saturday programs: On occasion we offer a special program on a Saturday or in the evening to support working caregivers/parents unable to attend our regular programs.

In 2023, EarlyON Facilitator Donna Fleming was trained to offer **Roots of Empathy**. Through this program children are coached to recognize and connect with the vulnerability and humanity of a baby who visits their classroom throughout the school year with their parent(s), along with a trained Roots of Empathy Instructor. Donna delivered **6 sessions** through Nov-Dec 2023 at River Heights Public School in Dorchester, serving **25 unique children**.

Our Program Reach



When a family first visits a location for an in-person program, they are marked as unique (new). If a family visits another location for an in-person program, they are again marked as unique at that respective location. All children and caregivers/parents are marked as visitors each time they attend a program.



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Virtual Programs

Bounce Back and Thrive is a resiliency skills training program designed to meet the needs of parents (and those in a parenting role) of children under the age of 8. BBT helps parents gain self-regulation and thinking skills that increase their capacity to provide caring relationships and role model resilience-building skills in daily interactions with their children. Then, it shows parents how to directly introduce basic resiliency skills to children, and that helps children bounce back and thrive. This program is 10-weeks and offered in the evenings virtually.

Baby Time Special Topics: Our EarlyON Facilitator Allison offers a special topic for caregivers with infants under the age of 12-months. These include Infant Massage, Secure Attachment, Making your Own Baby Food, Sleep topics, CPR/First Aid

Facilitating Connections

The EarlyON Team is available to support families in facilitating connections to family-centered services, providing information on parenting or child-development topics and other types of consultations to support caregivers in their role.

In 2022, the team was involved in over 450 individual consultations. The majority of connections made were in the area of early learning/parenting and safety (e.g. car seat safety).

DEVELOPMENTAL SCREENING SUPPORT

Evidence shows that the earlier development is assessed the greater the chance a child has to reach his or her potential.

Our team supported many families in 2023 in discussing topics such as: Physical Growth, Social/Emotional Development, Motor Skills, Language Development and More! The team connected families to a variety of family-centered services to support child development.

Ready Set Learn Program

Ready Set Learn is a 4-week program that will provide caregivers and their child with a learning experience that will support a successful school start. Each week we offer activities that will support children in developing skills and behaviours integral to the school transition. As well, caregivers are able to engage in conservations with our Early Childhood Educator on a variety of learning and development topics.

Our Ready Set Learn Program in 2023 supported over 40 families. We offered 4 programs - one in Dorchester, one in Ilderton and two in Strathroy.

Highlights of the impact the program had on school readiness are outlined below:

- 100% reported having a better understanding of the value of doing the activities learned to support school readiness
- 84% reported using what they learned to do something new or different to support school readiness
- Over 92% reported learning something new to support school readiness.



What did you like about the program?



Format/structure. Mirrored a true FDK program/day.

The effort put in to getting the kids to be independent right from the moment you walk in the door. Including coat, boots, mitts.

It was very much like a classroom setting right down to finding their name on their coat hook.

Very organized/planned out each week to target behaviours and skills that children will need for school.

This is such an amazing program and it was great to see all the children interacting and us as parents being able to see what we need to do at home in order to support ourselves and our children as they embark on this new and exciting journey going to school. I also have to mention that the Facilitator Donna was amazing. She created a very calm environment to support all the children in the room, she created great activities for the children to practice and encouraged conversations for parents to discuss.

Roots of Empathy

In November, Miss Donna began a program in a kindergarten classroom at River Heights Elementary School called **Roots of Empathy**. This program teaches children about their own feelings and feelings of others.

Once every three weeks baby Makai and his mom will visit the classroom. The children will gather together and watch him grow over 27 weeks. Miss Donna will coach the children in observing and reading the cues Makai gives as to how he is feeling. "Is he sad/happy? How can you tell?" We use this discussion as a lever for the children to talk about their own emotions and understand how their classmates feel. Miss Donna will also visit the classroom before and after each family visit to prepare and reinforce teachings.











Family Feedback

In 2023, families were given the opportunity to provide feedback around the local child care and early years service system. This feedback would help shape the priorities for a 5 year service system plan. **Six hundred and nine (609) caregivers participated.**

Below are some highlights pertaining to feedback around EarlyON.

- There was a lot of interest in additional days/week of programming
- Respondents had great interest in more Open Spaces opportunities including number of spaces per program, number of program per week, more locations, and weekend opportunities
- Desire for expansion of outdoor play spaces in more locations
- More use of parks and splash pads for outdoor programs
- More sensory options and accommodations in programs
- More Indigenous focused days



2024 Priorities

In response to the feedback provided, the following are some of the priorities for 2024:



- Advocate for additional funding to support EarlyON
 operations in a large geographic rural area
- Explore engaging opportunities to provide occasional evening and weekend programs for working parents and to respond to emerging community needs for programs and services through EarlyON
- Explore opportunities for developing and offering inclusive and culturally-relevant programs or spaces for Indigenous, Francophone, 2SLGBTQIA+ and Newcomer families and for children with special or complex needs

Communication & Promotion

Upon registration, families are asked how they heard about Middlesex EarlyON programs.

Allison Beauchamp, EarlyON Senior Facilitator

Allison is a Registered Early Childhood Educator with +25 years of experience in the early years' field.
