

2024 Budget Highlights

- The 2024 Budget reflects the County's commitment to making appropriate investments in the core services that our residents rely on, while also considering the reality that our taxpayers are facing increased costs of living from provincial and federal policy decisions
 - A tax rate increase of 2.93% means that for the value of a residential property, County taxes will increase by \$12.62 per \$100,000 of the value of the property according to its MPAC assessment.

Planning & Development

- Middlesex County is experiencing faster growth than historic rates, 9.2% over the last Census period and is projected to grow to between 96,300 and 115,000 people by 2046. With this growth the County is becoming more urbanized, and as a result planning, development, and housing considerations are increasingly complex
- The Province has put into effect and/or suggested significant alterations to planning-related legislation, regulations, and policies. These changes have already had, and will continue to exert, a substantial influence on the way land use planning is executed including placing additional responsibilities on municipalities. The Planning Department is working with municipalities to quickly respond to these changes



Planning & Development

- The Department has undertaken initiatives including implementing a Digital Planning (epermitting) System, providing enhanced 'selfserve' information, examining processes for streamlining, and developing a Solutions Based Planning Logic
- In 2024 it is planned to examine fast tracking of approvals for straightforward or prioritized application types, further prioritization of preapplication consultation, the evolution of the Digital Planning System, templating of common documents, and the continued progress of a 'public assistance' approach to file management
- It is planned to hire one additional planner to augment the services provided to municipalities



MLPS

- HOME (Health Outreach Mobile Engagement) program with MLPS Community Paramedicine for Middlesex County
- Review of ambulance deployment strategies realignment of ambulance resources to provide additional, and direct, support in Middlesex County
- Engagement with LHSC and Strathroy Middlesex General Hospital to mitigate and address increasing ambulance offload time (AOT)

Middlesex County Library

 Tales & Trails storytelling installations were completed in 2023 – 8 storytelling trails, one in each municipality. This year we are working on partnerships with community organizations to share their stories through these interactive installations.

Local Initiatives

Municipality of Middlesex Centre

- Planning & Development
 - Official Plan update approved in 2023; thirdparty appeals continue
- Information Technology Services
 - Coldstream Office Renovation and Expansion
 - IT Service Agreement
- Middlesex County Library
 - Launching the Expanded Access hours at the Coldstream Branch this spring – patrons will be able to apply for special access to the branch outside of staffed hours, allowing for greater access and convenience for the community.
