Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to provide council with a mid-year update regarding bylaw enforcement statistics pertaining to the first half of the 2024 calendar year.

Background:

The Municipality of Middlesex Centres bylaw department operates on a reactive, complaint-basis regarding bylaw enforcement, except for violations that are an immediate threat to health or safety of the community.

The Municipality is committed to the delivery of municipal law enforcement services in a timely and effective manner. The goal of these services is to achieve compliance with municipal by-laws through education and enforcement. By regularly analyzing bylaw statistics, we can discover underlying patterns and trends that will facilitate decision-making and proper resource management in the future.

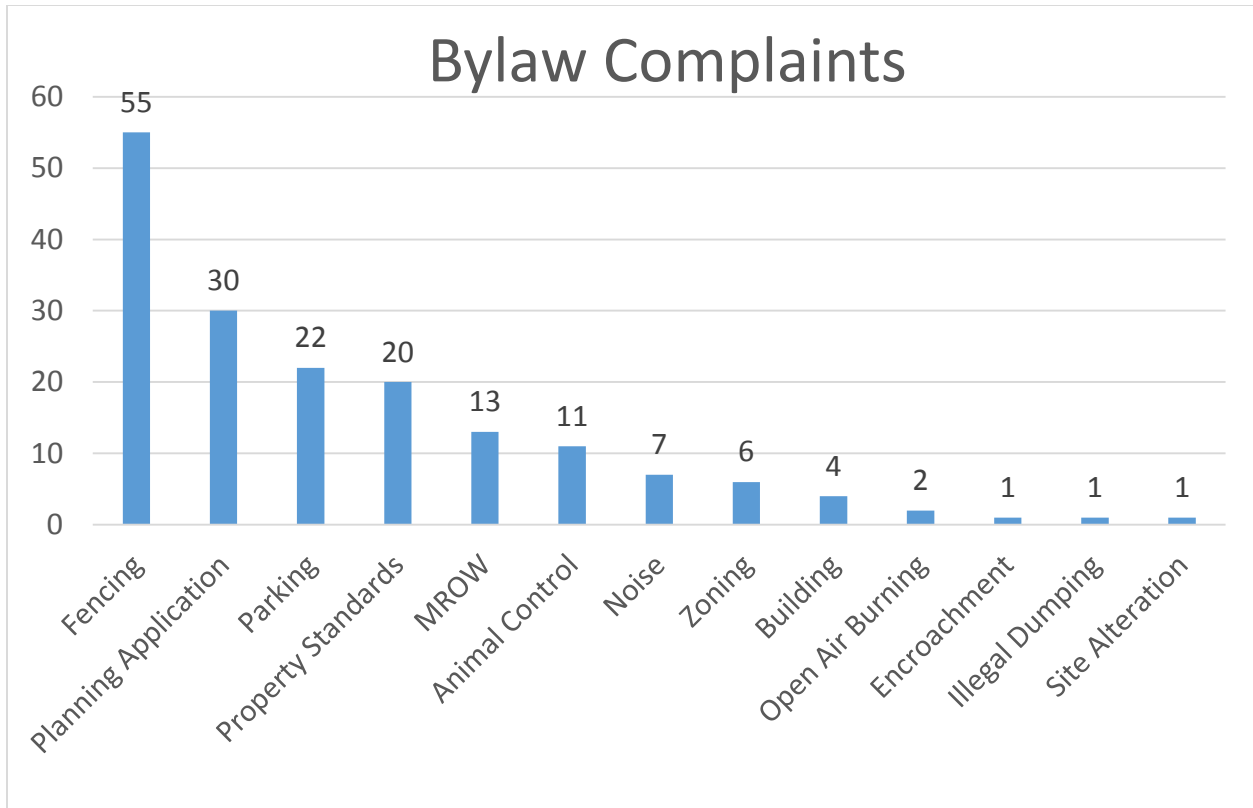
Analysis:

High Level Statistics from January 1, 2024 – June 30, 2024

Calls to bylaw enforcement: 173 total

Provincial Offences Notices (PONs): 6 total

Parking Tickets: 42 total



*During the first half of the calendar year, building/bylaw began to clear all open swimming pool permits. These calls are included within the fence call statistics leading to an overall increase in fence call statistics.
