Subject: Council Grants and Delaware Hydro Reserve Fund Program 2025

#### Recommendation:

THAT in accordance with the Council Grants Policy:

- the request from Camp-Kee-Mo-Kee be approved in the amount of \$1,285; and
- request from the Del-Ko-Brydge Canada Day Community be approved in the amount of \$2,000; and
- the request from the Ilderton & Area Business Association be approved in the amount of \$5,000; and
- the request from the Middlesex Centre Archives be approved in the amount of \$2,680; and
- the request from the Optimist Club of Bryanston-Birr be approved in the amount of \$1,600; and
- the request from the Optimist Club of Ilderton be approved in the amount of \$850; and
- the request from the Optimist Club of Kilworth-Komoka be approved in the amount of \$1,000; and
- the request from the Poplar Hill Lions be approved in the amount of \$1,500; and
- the request from the Poplar Hill Picnic be approved in the amount of \$1,200; and
- the request from the Tri-County Heritage Club be approved in the amount of \$1,500; and

AND THAT the request from the Delaware Lioness be approved in the amount of \$900 in accordance with the Delaware Hydro Reserve Fund Policy;

AND FURTHER THAT staff be directed to prepare correspondence and/or issue payment to the above noted organizations.

## **Purpose:**

To make recommendations to Council regarding the requests for grants for financial assistance to groups within Middlesex Centre.

# **Background:**

The purpose of the Council Grants and Delaware Hydro Reserve Fund programs is to provide municipal funds or other forms of assistance, in limited amounts, to community groups and organizations that warrant municipal support.

Applications are available online year-round and close on November 30<sup>th</sup> of each year. After the budget is passed, a committee consisting of the Director of Corporate Services, the Director of Community Services and the Manager of Strategic Communications meets to discuss and evaluate the applications. The recommendations from this committee are presented to Council for their consideration.

## **Analysis:**

# Council Grants Program

The Council Grants Program exists to recognize the value of the work of non-profit groups to the well-being and growth of the community, and in helping the municipality retain a strong community focus.

#### Focus areas:

- Tourism/Economic Development
- Community
- The Arts
- Culture and Heritage
- Environmental Awareness & Sustainability
- Other

Under the program, a maximum of \$20,000 is included in the budget each year for this program. Grants are awarded to:

- A maximum of \$5,000 per organization has been established for financial contributions.
- A maximum of \$2,000 per organization has been established for in-kind services. In-kind support will be limited to the use of municipal property at reduced or no cost, municipal staff support and loan of municipal equipment.

Key eligibility requirements include:

- The organization must have a clearly stated purpose and function that result in an improvement in community services within the Municipality of Middlesex Centre and the organization must be responsible for the planning and provision of these services.
- Organizations must be non-profit community groups and organizations and be based in or connected to the Municipality of Middlesex Centre.
- Programs/community events must be open to all residents of Middlesex Centre and must benefit Middlesex Centre residents.

# Program Review - 2025

The Council Grant Program has not been reviewed since 2016. In 2025, staff are planning to review the program to ensure it is continuing to meet the needs of both the municipality and local community groups. (This review was to be conducted in 2024, but this project has been moved to 2025.)

#### 2025 Requests for Funding

The Municipality received 15 applications totalling \$48,880 (exclusive of in-kind requests) for 2025. Ten of the applicants had applied for funding in previous years. A summary of the application requests and staff recommendations for funding are presented in the table which follows.

Also included in the Council Grants are \$250 for a local high school scholarship and \$1,000 for the Ilderton Agricultural Society Grant, as part of their lease agreement.

All recipients of the council grants program are to submit a written report on how the money was spent and results of the event/project.

- \*A note on in-kind requests and contributions: In-kind requests put forward as part of the grant application process, if approved, are handled a variety of ways, depending on the nature of the program.
  - 1. Council Grants: In this case, the value of the in-kind is charged to the Council Grants program, and funds are transferred from the Council Grants program to the applicable municipal budget line.
  - 2. Community Services Fee Waiver Program: In this case, the value of the in-kind is charged to the Community Services as part of their fee waiver program. The value of these waivers is not reflected in the Council Grants program allocations, but the details are noted below.
  - 3. Agreement: In some cases, there is a formal agreement on the use of a facility or property. The value of these agreements is not reflected in the Council Grants program allocations, but the details are noted below.

Community Outreach Committee of St. John the Devine Church	Student Pizza Lunch Program & Choir Scholarship	\$5,000	\$0	St. John the Devine is seeking funding to offset the costs of their monthly Student Pizza Lunch program for students at Medway High School and to support their choir scholarship program.  The intention of the Council Grants Program is to provide funding to programs that are open to all residents in Middlesex Centre. The pizza lunch program is servicing a small and very specific group (students at Medway High School). As such, staff are not recommending funding for this project under the Council Grants Program.  Additionally, the Council Grants program does not support direct donations or third-party funding, so a contribution to a group for them to then offer a scholarship is not eligible for funding.	2024: Application for the Student Pizza Lunch Program was declined.

Staff recommend that no funding (including value of in-kind use of park) be provided through the Council Grants Program as the Cycling Challenge is a fundraiser for a third party, thus making it ineligible under the grant criteria. Ilderton & Area Business Association (IABA)	Main Street Christmas Light Replacement	\$5,000	\$5,000	The IABA is seeking funds to replace the Ilderton Main Street Christmas Lights.  Staff recommended providing the funding for this request. It aligns with the grant's tourism and economic development theme, as well as supporting Middlesex Centre's Strategic Plan initiatives. The lights should last for many years.	New
Ilderton Farmers Market	Signage and Marketing	\$3,000	\$0	Funding is being sought for marketing, on-line promotions, insurance, and temporary banners/signage.  Staff recommend that no funding be provided through the Council Grants as marketing and insurance are operational in nature, and thus ineligible. The market owners charge a fee to vendors to attend, so they have an avenue to recoup operating costs. It should be noted that the municipality is no longer involved in this weekly event as it is hosted at a local church.	New

The event is described as having keynote presentations, wellness workshops, resource fair, etc. The request is for funding to cover costs related to event planning, materials, marketing, and accessibility enhancements.  Staff recommend that no funding be provided through the Council Grants. While it has the potential to be a valuable event, it will cater to a very small demographic and not the community at large. It should be noted that community centre rental rates are already subsidized 60% by the taxpayer.  Staff would suggest that the Ilderton Ladies Social consider reapplying in future years once the event is more established and if they can demonstrate local interest for this event.	New
Komoka Railway Museum (KRM)	Station Building Deck Replacement	\$5,000	\$0	KRM is requesting funding for replacing the decking at the site.  Funds were granted to KRM in 2022 to improve decking and walkways around the Railway Museum building. Funds for this project were also awarded in 2021 and other previous years. Some improvements have been made, however more are required.  Staff appreciate the need to replace the decking, particularly as the museum is located on municipal property. However, staff are concerned with the lack of action by the KRM on this issue as they have received funds for this purpose in past at the work is not complete.  As such, staff recommend that no funding be provided through the Council Grants for 2025. Staff would encourage KRM to speak to Community Services when they are at the point of seeking building permits for their decking plans. Staff recommend funding to cover the costs associated with the McLean collection and a grant towards the Heritage Fair event that the MCA can put towards the costs associated with the Fair. Unfortunately, the cost of the subscription is ineligible as it is an operating cost.  Note - The municipality is in a lease agreement with the Archives at a cost of \$0 for the rented space (495sq.ft.) at the Delaware Community Centre.	2024: \$4,630 2023: \$5,000 2022: \$5.000 2021: \$5,000 2020: \$2,250 2019: \$1,500

Optimist Club of Kilworth- Komoka	Various Community Events	\$10,000	\$1,000	The Kilworth-Komoka Optimists provide several community events for youth in the southern part of Middlesex Centre. They are seeking funds this year to offset the costs of renting Middlesex Centre facilities for these events and their meetings, and for sponsoring skating at Middlesex Centre arena.  With respect to the rental fees request, staff are concerned about the precedent set by offering to cover the costs of room rentals at municipal facilities, particularly for meetings, which are "operational" in nature, and thus not covered by the Council Grants. If this funding is provided for the Kilworth-Komoka Optimists, we may find all community groups requesting the same consideration. It should be noted that Middlesex Centre offers one free rental to each community group as well as reduced rental rates at municipal community centres.  With respect to the skating sponsorship, the Council Grants do not allow for funding a third party (in this case, the municipality would be the third party).  Staff are aware of the success of the special community events offered by the Kilworth-Komoka Optimists for youth in Middlesex Centre. While funding is not available for the specific items requested, staff recommend a grant of \$1,000 to help the Optimists with the costs of hosting the Hallowe'en Family Dance and the Breakfast with Santa.	2024: \$5,000 2023: carryover 2022: carryover 2021: carryover 2020: \$2,000

## Delaware Hydro Reserve Fund

Each year, Middlesex Centre makes available up to 50% of the interest earned by the Delaware Hydro Reserve Fund in the previous year. This is approximately \$20,500 this year.

Individuals and community organizations can apply for funding for capital projects that meet certain eligibility requirements. Up to 50% of the cost of the capital project may be covered by the Delaware Hydro Reserve Fund, with the 50% balance contributed by the individual(s) or the community organization.

Expenditures from the fund may include, but not limited to:

- Capital projects to improve the general appearance of Delaware Village;
- Capital projects that improve access to Delaware community facilities and programs by children, seniors, and people with disabilities; and
- Capital projects that improve or add to the municipal infrastructure in Delaware Village.
