This office has reviewed the above-mentioned report, which has been submitted to this ministry as a condition of licensing in accordance with Part VI of the Ontario Heritage Act, R.S.O. 1990, c 0.18. <sup>1</sup> This review has been carried out in order to determine whether the licensed professional consultant archaeologist has met the terms and conditions of their licence, that the licensee assessed the property and documented archaeological resources using a process that accords with the 2011 Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists set by the ministry, and that the archaeological fieldwork and report recommendations are consistent with the conservation, protection and preservation of the cultural heritage of Ontario.<sup>2</sup>

The Stage 4 mitigation of development impacts of Glendon Drive Location 1 (AfHi-372) resulted in the complete excavation and removal of the archaeological site within the proposed development, which no longer exists in the ground and has been fully documented. The archaeological value of the site now lies solely with the artifact assemblage, high precision mapping and field documentation. As such, in accordance with Section 3.4.2 and Section 3.4.3 of the MTCS' 2011 Standards and Guidelines for Consultant Archaeologists (Government of Ontario 2011b), Glendon Drive Location 1 (AfHi-372) no longer retains cultural heritage value or interest and does not require further archaeological investigation. No further assessment of Glendon Drive Location 1 (AfHi-372) is recommended.

The MTCS is asked to review the results presented and to accept this report into the Ontario Public Register of Archaeological Reports.
