Recommendation:

Purpose:

To advise Council of the status of building permit activity for Middlesex Centre for the first three quarters of 2021.

Background:

Building permit activity for the first three quarters of 2021 continues an increase over previous years. New residential starts for 2021 total 247 (including Mobile Homes), new dwellings (11 shy of the 2020 year end total). Similar reports will be provided to our four partner municipalities and provided to Middlesex Centre Council following those presentations. Further information is outlined below in Tables 1 and 2.
